Clinical Teaching Faculty Positions

The College of Social Work at the University of South Carolina invites applications and nominations for 2-3 clinical faculty teaching positions. Our goal is to build on and expand our strengths in preparing students for competent, professional social work practice.

Qualifications for clinical teaching faculty positions are commensurate with rank and include an outstanding or promising record in social work education and curriculum development. The MSW degree is required and a doctorate in social work is preferred. Two years post-MSW experience are required and additional practice experience is preferred. Social work licensure required. Senior-level appointments require substantial experience in social work education or professional social work practice, and expectation for curricular leadership.

The College of Social Work is a premier setting to advance the social well-being of vulnerable populations through interdisciplinary, community-engaged teaching, research, and scholarship. Its academic offerings include BSW, MSW, and PhD programs. Founded in 1801, the University of South Carolina spans an eight campus, fully-accredited system, and is designated by the Carnegie Foundation for the Advancement of Teaching as a “very high research activity” institution with “community engagement” distinction.
