

## **Two Positions**

**Loyola University Chicago's School of Social Work** invites applications for a faculty position. This tenure-tenure/track appointment will begin July 1, 2009. Salary and benefits for this position are competitive, pending final approval of funding.

### **Minimum Qualifications**

Appointment may be made at the Associate Professor or Full Professor level, depending on qualifications. Candidates will be expected to have completed the requirement for tenure at the level of the rank of the position. Applicants must hold a Ph.D. (Social Work preferred) An MSW from an accredited school of social work is required.

### **Preferred Qualifications**

Applicants should demonstrate interest and experience in teaching, research and scholarship. Consideration will be given to those applicants with demonstrated interest in the areas of aging. Candidates should have strong clinical experience (two years post masters) as well as a demonstrated record of grants and scholarship. Teaching responsibilities in two content areas (practice, human behavior, research and policy) may include the undergraduate and graduate levels. The candidate should also have experience and/or willingness to experiment with on line teaching. Opportunities for interdisciplinary collaboration are encouraged. Affiliation with the Institute for Intergenerational Studies and Practice is expected.
