Applications are invited for a tenure-track faculty position at the rank of Assistant Professor for Fall 2011. The successful candidate must have an earned doctorate in social work or a related social science by September 1, 2011, an MSW degree, a developing research agenda and potential for excellence in teaching in both the Foundation and Concentration curricula. Two or more years of post-MSW practice experience is preferred. Candidates must demonstrate a commitment to research, scholarly publication, and preparation of research proposals for external funding.

Faculty members conduct a range of research with diverse populations across the life cycle.
