The School has established a joint degree program with the School of Law and a joint degree program with the College of Public Health. In response to the pervasiveness of social and economic injustice throughout society, the School of Social Work is committed to hiring new faculty who work towards alleviating disparities through their teaching, scholarship/research, service and/or administrative responsibilities.

Requirements for position include a doctorate in social work or closely related field and an M.S.W. The successful candidate will demonstrate a strong research capacity and the potential to generate external research funding. In addition, the school is seeking individuals with a willingness to teach across the B.S.W. and M.S.W. programs. Previous experience or interest with online teaching is desired. The University of Georgia School of Social Work is committed to having a diverse faculty culture. Salary is commensurate with record of achievements and rank. Responsibilities include: scholarship, teaching, field liaison and public service. Two years post-master's practice experience required.

The position is designed with a broad-based, "advanced generalist" approach to teaching, research, and learning. The successful candidate will possess the ability to teach and mentor students in both MSW concentrations—Clinical Practice and Community Empowerment and Program Development. As well, the successful candidate will be expected to teach effectively with traditional and non-traditional MSW students, including MSW students in the part-time program at the Gwinnett University Center.
