Director of Field Education

The College of Social Work at the University of South Carolina invites applications and nominations for the Director of Field Education. The Director oversees the assignment of students and faculty field liaisons to agency placements; develops and maintains appropriate records and communications with field agencies; plans and implements field instructor training; develops field education resources; and provides administrative leadership of the field instruction staff and faculty liaisons.

The College of Social Work is a premier setting to advance the health and social well-being of vulnerable populations through transdisciplinary, community-engaged teaching, research, and service. Its academic offerings include BSW, MSW, and Ph.D. programs, with an enrollment of approximately 500 students. The University of South Carolina spans an eight-campus, fully-accredited system, and is designated by the Carnegie Foundation for the Advancement of Teaching as a "very high research activity" institution with "community engagement" distinction.

Qualifications for this non-tenure-track clinical faculty position are commensurate with rank and include a promising or outstanding record in social work field education and curriculum development. The MSW degree is required, with a doctorate in social work preferred. Significant experience in social work practice with individuals, families, groups, communities, organizations, or social policy is required.
