Appointments may begin on July 1, 2015, or January 1, 2016. All candidates must have a Ph.D. (in social work or in another behavioral, social science, or related discipline); those applying for foundations and clinical practice positions should have a social work master's degree and two years of practice experience.

Review of applicants will begin immediately. Preference will be given to those applications received by December 6, 2014.

Minimum Qualifications include a Ph.D. in Social Work or another social or behavioral science. Those applying for clinical practice teaching positions should also have social work master's degree and two years of practice experience. All applicants should have a demonstrated record of teaching excellence at the University level. An ability to learn and incorporate new media technology to enhance instruction, and evidence of professional growth and activity in the social work field is strongly preferred. Applicants should upload a CV, cover letter, and list of references at the site noted below.
