For Fall 2013 the NC State University Department of Social Work is looking to fill the following full-time position:

### **Postdoctoral Scholar**

The Department of Social Work at NC State University has offered a Bachelor of Social Work (BSW) for over 30 years and is among the earliest accredited BSW programs in the United States. In fall 2005, we commenced a Master of Social Work program and we introduced an Advanced Standing program in 2010. The mission of the Department of Social Work is to prepare students for practice that is sensitive to the social, economic, cultural, demographic and political contexts that shape our state and beyond.

The Department of Social Work at NC State invites applications for a Postdoctoral Scholar position in social work practice beginning August 16, 2013. The position is for a one-year appointment in the Department of Social Work. The successful candidate should have an MSW and a strong background in direct practice in addition to experience as a teaching assistant professor, lecturer, or instructor. The hire of a teaching post-doc with a 2/2 teaching load would assist greatly with social work's undergraduate program by teaching 1-2 upper division courses. The position is expected to last for one year. We are particularly interested in candidates who are prepared to teach courses in Research Methods and Evaluation. Motivation to conduct and publish research is expected. The successful candidate will pursue their own research, give talks, and deliver a research presentation in the spring semester summarizing research progress that is expected to result in publications. The Department of Social Work has extensive outreach partnerships within the university and with a variety of community agencies.

Qualifications: MSW from a Council on Social Work Education (CSWE) accredited program; a Ph.D. in Social Work or closely related field awarded no more than five years from date of postdoctoral appointment.
