ASSISTANT PROFESSOR IN SOCIAL WORK

The University of Iowa, School of Social Work seeks dynamic candidates for a tenure-track assistant professor position (9-month academic year appointment) in family centered social work practice, beginning August 19, 2015. Candidates should demonstrate potential for a strong research agenda that complements the faculty scholarship areas in aging, child welfare, family violence, mental health, or culturally competent social work practice.

The University of Iowa is a member of the Association of American Universities and a Carnegie Foundation designated RU/VH University with an enrollment of 32,000 undergraduate and graduate students. - Sustain an active program of scholarship as evidenced by peer reviewed publications and conference presentations
- Pursue external funding to support a focused program of research
- Teach and mentor diverse students in the School's programs
- Provide service in support of the School's and University's mission
- Add intellectual diversity and cultural richness to the School

Required qualifications:

- PhD in social work or related field (with the dissertation successfully defended by June 30, 2015)

- If the PhD is not in social work, an MSW is required
- Evidence of a strong research agenda with demonstrated potential to conduct research and publish in a substantive area of social work
- Potential for securing external research funding
- Demonstrated attention to human diversity and/or cultural competence in teaching, research, or service

Desired qualifications:

- Master's degree in Social Work
- Two years of social work micro or macro-level practice experience
- Scholarly publications in refereed journals
- Experience applying for external funding of research
- Evidence of ability to teach micro or macro social work practice
