Purpose of Universities

Morrill Act of 1862 (Land grants)

"teach agriculture, military tactics, and the mechanic arts, as well as classical studies, to members of the working classes so that they could obtain a liberal, practical education."



Implications on Faculty

- Focus on increasing numbers of output
 - Publications our "currency"
- Focus on securing funding
- Students viewed as EFTS
- Less incentives by universities for collaboration
 - Colleges/Departments structured as "cost centers"
- Focus on professionalism rather than social responsibility
